

Kids Under 13?

The Right Seat is the Back Seat!



Children under age 13 should always ride in the rear seat of the vehicle.

In Louisiana, this is the law!



Graduating from a booster seat to a regular seat belt does not mean children can ride in the front seat.

All children, regardless of height or weight, must remain in the back seat until they are 13.

**Not only is this the law, it is also the best
- and safest -
choice you can make for your family.**

Don't take your child out of a booster seat too soon!

In 2024, 42% of crash fatalities in Louisiana for children under 14 resulted from not being properly restrained in a vehicle.

Children should remain in a booster seat until they are able to pass the
5 Step Seatbelt Test:

- ✓ Able to sit all the way back against the vehicle seat.
- ✓ Knees bend comfortably over the edge of the seat.
- ✓ Lap belt goes across upper hips and thighs, not the abdomen.
- ✓ Shoulder strap crosses the center of the chest between the neck and shoulder.
- ✓ Child can maintain this position for the entire ride.
