Each Emphasis Area includes specific tactics for all road users. Within each emphasis area, the SHSP also considers:

- Older Drivers (65+)
- Young Drivers (15-24)
- Vulnerable Road Users

Vulnerable road users (VRUs) include pedestrians, bicyclists, and those using personal conveyance devices, such as wheelchairs and electric scooters.



Our goal is to create a transportation system that is not only safe for vehicles, but also for people who walk, bike, and roll.

Nearly 800 deaths on average occur on Louisiana roads each year, and fatalities continue to rise in Louisiana and across the nation.

The Strategic Highway Safety Plan (SHSP) guides us to our destination: zero deaths. The SHSP is a living document updated every five years with input from a broad array of stakeholders, including:

- Driver Behavior Safety Experts
- Engineers
- Law Enforcement Personnel
- Emergency Service Providers
- Advocacy Groups
- And more

A Regional Focus

Locals know their highways and their neighbors best, so Louisiana employs a regional approach to safety. We established nine coalitions across the state that implement the SHSP within their region.
